BC VEGETABLE MARKETING COMMISSION APPOINTMENTS OF TWO INDEPENDENT MEMBERS

The Commission has completed its interim merit-based appointment process for two (2) temporary independent members.

I am pleased to announce the appointment of Natalie Janssens and Craig W. Evans to the BC Vegetable Marketing Commission as of January 14,2022, for a minimum of one year to a maximum of three years. The exact length of the term will be determined by the Commission on completion of the Election Policy Review.

Natalie Janssens was born and raised on Nicomekl Farms, a large organic dairy in Surrey, BC. After receiving a Bachelor of Arts (BA) degree from the University of Victoria, Natalie completed a Master of Public Administration (MPA) at Dalhousie University.
