#### B. Compliance Agreement Requirements for Pepper Plant Propagation Facilities

- 1. The facility must be located in the Greater Vancouver Regional District or the Fraser Valley Regional District.
- 2. The facility must have a pest monitoring program in place for Tobacco Blue Mold (TBM; *Peronospora tabacina*), which includes the following:
  - Designated individuals must be trained to recognize the signs and symptoms of TBM.
  - The pepper plants must be monitored weekly through the entire crop cycle.
  - Pest monitoring records for TBM must be maintained during the growing season and be made available to the CFIA upon request. Records must be dated and initialled.
- 3. The facility must contact CFIA immediately if any signs or symptoms of TBM are detected.
- 4. *Nicotiana* spp. plants must not be transported into or grown within the facility.
- 5. The facility must be inspected by the CFIA on an annual basis.

Failure to comply with any of the above requirements will result in the cancellation of the propagation facility's approval status and registration.

#### B. Compliance Agreement Requirements for Pepper Plant Propagation Facilities

- 1. The facility must be located in the Greater Vancouver Regional District or the Fraser Valley Regional District.
- 2. The facility must source the pepper plants from CFIA-registered propagation facilities. Copies of purchase invoices must be presented to the CFIA on request and must be kept on file until the end of the crop cycle.
- 3. The facility must have a pest monitoring program in place for Tobacco Blue Mold (TBM; *Peronospora tabacina*), which includes the following:
  - Designated individuals must be trained to recognize the signs and symptoms of TBM.
  - The pepper plants must be monitored weekly throughout the entire crop cycle.
  - Any TBM host plants that are present in the environment surrounding the facility must be monitored from July 1<sup>st</sup> to September 30<sup>th</sup> each year.
  - Pest monitoring records for TBM must be maintained during the growing season and be made available to the CFIA upon request. Records must be dated and initialled.



- 4. The facility must contact CFIA immediately if any signs or symptoms of TBM are detected.
- 5. *Nicotiana* spp. plants may not be transported into or grown within the facility.
- Product storage areas must be regularly cleaned and disinfected in accordance with good agricultural practices. Cleaning and disinfection written procedure must be available for CFIA.
- 7. The facility must be inspected by the CFIA on an annual basis.

Failure to comply with any of the above requirements will result in the cancellation of the production facility's approval status and registration.

#### B. Compliance Agreement Requirements for Pepper Fruit Packing Facilities

- 1. The facility must be located in the Greater Vancouver Regional District or the Fraser Valley Regional District.
- 2. To be eligible for export to Japan the pepper fruit must be sourced from approved production facilities. Copies of purchase invoices or delivery slips must be presented to the CFIA on request and must be kept on file until the end of the crop cycle.
- 3. The facility must have written procedures for cleaning and disinfecting the packing house and storage areas. Records demonstrating that these areas are regularly cleaned and disinfected, in accordance with good agricultural practices, must be provided to the CFIA on request.
- 4. The facility must segregate the packing of pepper fruit that is eligible for export to Japan from packing other pepper fruit. The packing lines must be cleaned and sanitized prior to packing peppers for export to Japan. Storage areas must have clearly identified areas dedicated to peppers that will be exported to Japan.



- 5. The packing facility must use packing materials that are new and free of tobacco blue mold (TBM; Peronospora tabacina).
- 6. Pepper fruit must be packaged, or the pallets must be wrapped, in a manner that prevents any possible infection by TBM.
- 7. Each shipping unit of peppers that has been certified by the CFIA for export to Japan must be sealed with pallet straps and labelled 'INSPECTED' and 'FOR JAPAN'.
- 8. The facility must store/hold shipments certified for Japan in a clearly marked area that is separate from other peppers.
- 9. The facility must be inspected by the CFIA on an annual basis.

Failure to comply with any of the above requirements will result in the cancellation of the packing facility's approval status and registration.
